# PREPARING FOR NEXT WEEK'S LITURGY

19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: 1 Kings 19:11-13
Elijah lived about 800 years
before Christ. Because he was loyal
to God, he fell into disfavor with
King Ahab and Queen Jezebel. He
fled to Mount Horeb. As you listen
to the passage, it will be helpful to
know that wind, earthquake, and
fire were scriptural expressions of
God's presence.

Second Reading: Romans 9:1-5
Paul begins to address the painful question of why some Jewish people rejected Christ. These were Paul's own people and he was personally hurt by this. He still loved his Jewish heritage and in today's passage he lists seven wonderful blessings that God's Old Testament people have received. He then adds an eighth: Christ the Messiah.

This Week's Question

For Adults:

How has faith in Jesus given me a new perspective on life?

For Children:

How would I describe the meaning of faith in Jesus?

### "Make Disciples of All Nations"

Jesus gave this final command to his disciples. (Mt.28:19). Its religious dimensions of this last injunction are staggering; so were the financial demands it placed on the first Christian community. They were a small band, people of modest means - fishermen, carpenters, farmers; yet they found the resources to carry out Jesus' command. Acts gives us a glimpse of their efforts. Paul journeyed to Asia Minor, Greece, Italy and made plans for Spain. Peter went to Antioch, then to Rome. Thomas, legend has it, journeyed to India. Still, that was only part of the story.

The first Christians not only sent missionaries. They also took on the burden of helping the poor, orphaned, widowed; their generosity was all the more remarkable because there were so few of them. What inspired them? Certainly it was the command of the Risen Lord. But they also had the words and example of Paul who asked the Corinthians for money to help the poor of Jerusalem. Contributing was a sacred act. One of the sacred functions of

Christians is to gather resources needed to spread the Good News of Jesus. Paul 🌡 could speak this way because he knew the impact that Christ had had on all creation.
